Subject: **OPERATIONALIZATION OF THE FINANCIAL ACT 2024/2025**

*This circular is issued under the authority given to South Sudan Revenue Authority by section 6 (2)(b) of the South Sudan Revenue Authority Act which empowers SSRA to administer the laws specified in the schedule 1 of the South Sudan Revenue Authority Act 2016 amended 2023. It seeks to operationalize the financial Act 2024/2025. Which was signed into Law effective November 25th, 2024. **The circular shall become effective December 2nd, 2024.***

PURPOSE OF THIS CIRCULAR.

The South Sudan Revenue Authority is responsible for administering and enforcing, *the laws relating to taxation, customs and revenues set out schedule 1 of the South Sudan Revenue Authority Act, 2016 (as amended).* For the fiscal year 2024/2025 applicable taxes, fees and other levies due to the National Government are specified in the Financial Act, 2024/2025 which become effective on the date of its signature by the President of the Republic on November 25th, 2024.

The coming into force of the Financial Act 2024/2025 on November 25th, 2024 effectively repeals and replaces taxes, customs duties, fees and other levies due to the National Government that had been imposed under the Financial Act, 2023/2024.

This circular serves as formal communication to all Business Community, Traders, Importers, and Exporters that, in accordance with the Financial Act 2024/2025, all customs duties, fees, and relevant levies on goods consigned for South Sudan ought to be remitted at the point of entry within the East African Community's countries prior to the release of the said goods. Payments may be made in South Sudan Pounds or in foreign currency; however, it is mandatory that all transactions must occur within the territorial jurisdiction of South Sudan.

By this circular, the Commissioner for Customs Revenue is directed to ensure that SSRA staff are posted to each of the points of entry in the regions for the purpose of taking over collection responsibilities as stipulated under the Financial Act 2024/2025. Consequently, they are hereby directed that **with effect from December 2nd, 2024, taxes, fees and other levies of the National Government throughout the Republic shall be as stipulated in the financial Act 2024/2025** until such time that the Act is repealed and replaced by another law.



The Commissioner for Customs Revenue is hereby directed to take all necessary measures to ensure taxes, fees and other levies due to the National Government are imposed in strict observance of the Financial Act 2024/2025 until advised in writing by the undersigned.
